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**BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF PUBLIC LANDS CONTINUES
TO SUPPORT WISCONSIN COMMUNITIES**

MADISON – The Board of Commissioners of Public Lands, as administrator of the State Trust Fund Loan Program, approved \$9.1 million in loan applications at today's board meeting. Listed below are the municipalities receiving State Trust Fund Loans:

- City of Menomonie – Dunn County / Finance capital projects / \$1,016,000
- City of Menomonie – Dunn County / Finance TID projects / \$203,000
- City of Mondovi – Buffalo County / Finance infrastructure improvements / \$495,000
- Village of Twin Lakes – Kenosha County / Refinance outstanding debt / \$590,000
- City of Virquoa – Vernon County / Finance street and parks projects / \$820,000
- Village of Weston – Marathon County / Finance capital improvement projects / \$2,500,000
- City of Wisconsin Rapids – Wood County / Finance street construction / \$500,000

In the last 12 months, including actions approved today, the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands has approved 259 loan applications totaling \$236.1 million. The loans can be made to municipalities and school districts for any public purpose.

Created in 1848 by the Wisconsin Constitution, the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands was established to accept federal land grants and to manage trust funds for the benefit of public education in Wisconsin. The Board consists of Secretary of State Doug La Follette, Attorney General J.B. Van Hollen and State Treasurer Dawn Marie Sass. The majority of Trust Fund assets are held in the Common School Fund, from which the majority of State Trust Fund loans are issued. Earnings from this fund are distributed to K-12 school libraries annually.
