**FUNDING FOR SCHOOL AND MUNICIPAL PROJECTS APPROVED BY  
THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF PUBLIC LANDS**

**MADISON** – The Board of Commissioners of Public Lands approved six loans totaling almost \$1.5 million to benefit school districts and municipalities across Wisconsin to fund their public purpose projects.

Loans approved at today's board meeting include:

- City of Abbotsford – Clark and Marathon Counties / Finance TIF district project / \$100,000
- School District of Glenwood City – Dunn and St. Croix Counties / Refinance prior service pension liability / \$483,000
- Town of Oakland – Burnett County / Finance the purchase of capital equipment and vehicles / \$290,000
- City of Oconto – Oconto County / Finance public works project / \$500,000
- City of Sturgeon Bay – Door County / Finance public works project / \$82,000
- City of Sturgeon Bay – Door County / Finance public works project / \$42,000

In the last 12 months, including actions approved today, the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands has approved 242 loan applications totaling \$220.1 million. The loans can be made to municipalities and school districts for any public purpose.

Created in 1848 by the Wisconsin Constitution, the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands was established to accept federal land grants and to manage trust funds for the benefit of public education in Wisconsin. The Board consists of Secretary of State Doug La Follette, Attorney General J.B. Van Hollen and State Treasurer Dawn Marie Sass. The majority of Trust Fund assets are held in the Common School Fund, from which the majority of State Trust Fund loans are issued. Earnings from this fund are distributed to K-12 school libraries annually.
