AGENDA ITEM #5 PROPOSED LAND MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATION CHANGE

RECITALS

- A. BCPL staff are asking the Board to consider and approve a change in policy regarding the certification of BCPL's land management practices. Staff are recommending a change from certification through the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) to the American Forest Federation (AFF) Tree Farm Group Certification Program.
- B. BCPL has owned forested school trust land for over 170 years and has sought to manage such lands in an economically and ecologically prudent manner for the benefit of our respective trust beneficiaries.
- C. In 2014, BCPL sought and obtained certification from FSC with respect to BCPL's land management practices.
- D. BCPL had sought such certification for two main reasons:
 - 1. To obtain feedback from a respected third party with respect to BCPL's conformance with best management practices; and
 - 2. To open more market access for BCPL timber sales.
- E. Since 2014, the focus of FSC certification has shifted away from reviewing land management practices. It became apparent that there were no additional markets open to BCPL because of such FSC certification and no timber price incentive compared to noncertified lands.
- F. Furthermore, the cost of annual FSC certification has increased substantially. At the present time, BCPL realistically does not have the financial or staff resources to continue in FSC certification.
- G. However, BCPL staff still place significant value on an independent review of our land management practices and staff have identified American Forest Foundation's Tree Farm Group Certification as the best route to go.
- H. The cost of such AFF certification is possible under BCPL's current budget constraints.
- I. BCPL staff recommend a policy change to have BCPL's land management practices certified through the American Forest Foundation certification program.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands authorizes staff to discontinue certification of its land management practices through the Forest Stewardship Council; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the staff is authorized to apply for and accept certification of its land management practices through the American Forest Foundation Tree Farm Group Certification program. The Executive Secretary is authorized and directed to execute any documents and take any actions reasonably necessary to complete such change.
