MOTION: Commissioner Van Hollen moved to approve the loans; Commissioner Schuller seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

ITEM 4. REQUEST TO EXPAND INVESTMENT AUTHORITY

Board Chair La Follette explained that staff was requesting to expand staff Trust Fund investment authority to include investments allowed by statute but not yet authorized by the Board and remove maximum investment amounts within investment categories.

The Board and staff discussed how and why the investment limitations were put in place. Staff explained that sometimes good opportunities arose on short notice to invest in bonds authorized by statute but which had not yet been discussed by the board. The recent offering and issuance of UW Hospital and Clinic bonds was cited as an example. The staff was now seeking authority to invest in other statutorily allowable bonds as long as such bonds had a rating of "A" or better from Moody's or other similar credit rating agencies.

MOTION: Commissioner Van Hollen was agreeable to granting the staff expanded investment authority but wanted the staff to report to the board on trust fund investments made outside the current authorizations for the purchase of state and municipal bonds. Commissioner Van Hollen made the following motion. Commissioner Schuller seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands authorizes staff to purchase any investment currently allowed for State Trust Fund investments within Section 24.61 of Wisconsin Statutes on condition that investments are limited to issuers or securities with a Moody's rating (or equivalent) of 'A' or better.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the current maximum bond investment limitations previously adopted by the Board are hereby removed. These expansions of investment authority are conditioned on the staff reporting at the next following board meeting on the purchase of any investment that would fall outside of the previously

adopted bond investment limitations. All purchases shall be made in accordance with Chapter 24 of the Wisconsin Statutes on such terms and conditions as the Executive Secretary determines to be reasonable and necessary. This purchase authority shall also include the authority to sell these bonds prior to maturity. The Executive Secretary is authorized and directed to execute any documents reasonably necessary to complete such transactions.

ITEM 5. PROPOSED LAND BANK PURCHASE – CRANDON TIMBER (P1302)

MOTION: Commissioner Van Hollen moved to approve the proposed land bank purchase; Commissioner Schuller seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands authorizes the purchase of the Property from Crandon Timber at the price not to exceed One Million Eight Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Two Hundred Thirty Dollars (\$1,875,230) in accordance with Chapter 24 of the Wisconsin Statutes on such terms and conditions as the Executive Secretary determines to be reasonable and necessary. The Executive Secretary is authorized and directed to execute any documents reasonably necessary to complete such purchase transaction.
