### Board Meeting Minutes November 15, 2022

#### ITEM 1. CALL TO ORDER

Board Chair Godlewski called the meeting to order at 2:02 p.m.

#### ITEM 2. APPROVE MINUTES – November 1, 2022

**MOTION:** Commissioner LaFollette moved to approve the minutes; Commissioner Kaul seconded the motion.

**DISCUSSION:** None

**VOTE:** The motion passed 3-0.

#### ITEM 3. APPROVE LOANS

**MOTION:** Board Chair Godlewski moved to approve the loans; Commissioner LaFollette seconded the motion.

**DISCUSSION:** Mr. Sneider commented that loan #2 to the City of Stevens Point is funding the incentives for two separate housing projects. The first one is the renovation of a historic convent that is no longer used by the church into workforce housing. The second is for a market based housing project near UW Stevens Point. Workforce housing is a term synonymous with affordable housing.

Commissioner LaFollette inquired about the two year loan to City of Wauwatosa.

Mr. Sneider explained that often cities borrow money on a short term basis as interim financing for the construction phase and then if long term financing if needed, they will go to the bond market. The State Trust Fund Loan Program works well for these situations because BCPL does not require lien waivers or other cumbersome paperwork that commercial banks might require.

**VOTE:** The motion passed 3-0

The Board of Commissioners of Public Lands (BCPL) unanimously approved \$6,160,000.00 in State Trust Fund Loans to support 4 community projects in Wisconsin.

- 1. City of Seymour / Outagamie County / Finance wastewater plant upgrades / \$875,000.00
- 2. City of Stevens Point / Portage County / Finance TID 11 development incentives / \$3,350,000.00
- 3. City of Wauwatosa / Milwaukee County / Finance Building and Transportation Projects / \$935.000.00
- 4. Town of Northfield / Jackson County / Finance roadwork / \$1,000,000.00

#### ITEM 6. CHIEF INVESTMENT OFFICER'S REPORT

Mr. Sneider reported that the investment committee approved two investments in infrastructure funds last week. These investments are contingent on receiving an approved third party due diligence report.

- 1.) \$25 million to the BlackRock Global Infrastructure Fund IV
- 2.) \$20 million to the KKR Open-Ended Infrastructure Fund.

We are excited about moving some money into that asset class.

#### ITEM 7. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

Executive Secretary German shared that we are going to close on the US Forest Service transaction. It looks like the closing will be in the next couple of weeks so, arrangements will be made to have the patents and deeds executed by the Commissioners. We are looking forward to closing this exciting chapter in agency history. He believes this to be the biggest transaction in the agency's history in at least the last 20 years. Also, things are moving forward with the Lac Courte Oreilles and we may bring that transaction to the board for consideration in the near future or by the end of the year. We are still waiting for the appraisal and some additional information from the tribe, but the tribe has expressed a lot of interest in in moving forward. It's been an exciting year for BCPL's northern office. Congratulations to BCPL staff on everything they've done.

#### ITEM 8. BOARD CHAIR'S REPORT

Board Chair Godlewski shared that there will be a press conference Thursday announcing the annual distribution. Emma has been working with everyone's team and we have received very good feedback from stakeholders that will be attending the press conference. ## AGENDA ITEM #5 PROPOSED UTILITY EASEMENT – ALLYN ROAD


#### **RECITALS**

- A. Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPS) desires an easement for an underground electric line along Allyn Road, a private road in BCPL's Lone Stone Lake block.
- B. The said easement will cover approximately 0.01 acres of BCPL land located in Oneida County. A survey of the easement is attached as Exhibit A.
- C. The easement area is in:

Township 39 North, Range 11 East, Town of Three Lakes, Oneida County
Section 11: Lot 1 of Block 2 of the Plat of Gary Post Tribune Lone Stone Lake
Addition, being part of Government Lot 11

- D. WPS has agreed to pay BCPL a total fee of \$500 for the easement.
- E. BCPL staff believes this is a reasonable payment considering the limited encumbrance on the BCPL parcel and recommends approval of the proposed utility easement.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands approves the utility easements with Wisconsin Public Service Corporation for the sum of \$500 in accordance with Chapter 24 of the Wisconsin Statutes on such terms and conditions as the Executive Secretary determines to be reasonable and necessary. The Executive Secretary is authorized and directed to execute any documents reasonably necessary to complete the easements.

## AGENDA ITEM #6 PROPOSED UTILITY EASEMENT – THUNDER LAKE ROAD PARCEL

#### **RECITALS**

A. In 1975 BCPL granted an easement to Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPS) for an overhead electric line that was built across the following parcel of land:

Township 38 North, Range 10 East, Town of Sugar Camp, Oneida County Section 16: Government Lot 2

- B. In 2016 WPS removed the overhead line and buried a new one along Thunder Lake Road (a public town road). A line was also buried in a north-south direction to serve a private parcel north of the BCPL parcel. WPS desires an easement for that portion of the line that is not along the town road, which covers approximately 0.15 acres.
- C. WPS has recorded a Release of Easement of the 1975 easement, which covered approximately 0.80 acres.
- D. The location of the old easement and the new easement are shown in Exhibit A.
- E. BCPL staff recommends approval of the proposed utility easement at no cost to WPS because WPS already had easement rights and by removing an overhead line that bifurcated the subject parcel and relocating the easement and electric line along the public town road, the burden of the easement upon the BCPL parcel is actually reduced.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands approves the utility easements with Wisconsin Public Service Corporation for the sum of \$0 in accordance with Chapter 24 of the Wisconsin Statutes on such terms and conditions as the Executive Secretary determines to be reasonable and necessary. The Executive Secretary is authorized and directed to execute any documents reasonably necessary to complete the easements.
